

2. WHAT HAS BEEN HAPPENING AT HOME ...



2.1. POPIA COMPLIANCE LEVELS CONCERNING UNSOLICITED DIRECT MARKETING ARE NOT VERY GOOD


The Information Regulator has issued <u>a statement in the</u> <u>media</u> that, in general, organisations are not complying with POPIA's requirements concerning unsolicited direct marketing.

2.2. MUNICIPALITIES IN THE RED

The Information Regulator has <u>also issued a statement</u> that the general levels of POPIA compliance amongst South African municipalities are very low.

2.3. NATIONAL BROADCASTER IN THE RED AS WELL

The Information Regulator has also <u>called out the SABC</u> for their poor levels of POPIA compliance concerning their handling of customer personal information.



3. WHAT HAS BEEN HAPPENING ABROAD ...

3.1. REGULATORS (STILL) CRACKING DOWN HARD ON THE TECH SECTOR

There have been several monumental data privacy fines for the tech sector in late 2022 and early 2023 (the likes of Google, Uber, WhatsApp and the rest of the Meta crowd). 3.2. SALE OF PERSONAL INFORMATION

Recently, the Court of Justice of the European <u>Union issued</u> <u>a decision</u> stating that controllers must reveal the entities to which they have sold a data subject's personal information upon request.

3.3. HEALTH DATA SCARE

An online pharmacy in the US has been fined USD15 million by the FTC for disclosing patient health personal information to social media platforms and other online advertisers such as Facebook and Google and failing to notify its customers.
